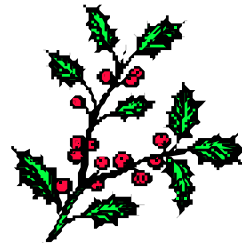


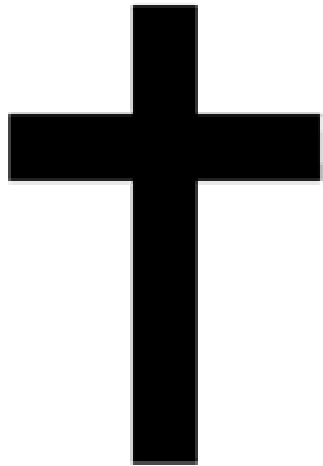


Christmas

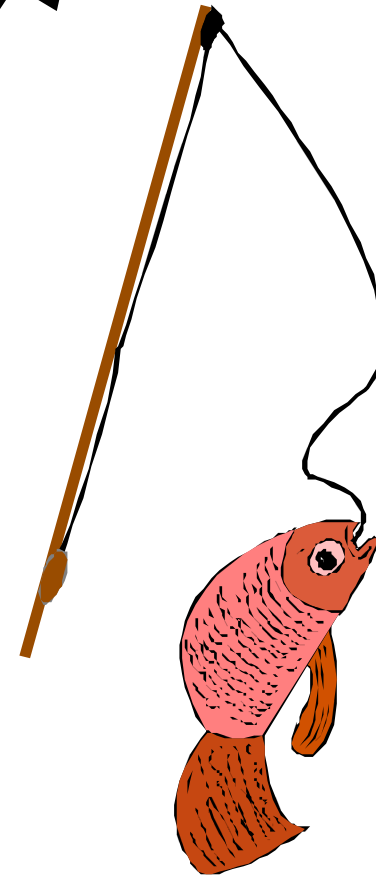
